GEORGE W. VETROVEC, M.D.

A native of Ohio, Dr. Vetrovec has spent most of his life in Virginia. He received his undergraduate (Phi Beta Kappa) and medical degrees from the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, Virginia. His Internal Medicine and Cardiology Specialty training was at the Medical College of Virginia Campus of Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, Virginia where he also served as a Chief Medical Resident. Since 1976, he has been on the faculty of Virginia Commonwealth University achieving the rank of full Professor in 1986. He was elected to AOA as a faculty member in 1986. Dr. Vetrovec's major administrative duties include: Chairman of the Division of Cardiology, Director of the Adult Cardiac Catheterization laboratory and Associate Chairman of Medicine for Clinical Affairs.

During his time at VCU, Dr. Vetrovec has served in multiple University Leadership capacities including chairing three search committees for Departmental Chairpersons as well as participating in three strategic planning processes. In addition, Dr. Vetrovec was an initial member of the restructured MCV Physicians Executive Board. Noteworthy has been his commitment to philanthropy, spearheading 2 fundraising campaigns which have secured over \$15 million in professorships and research funding for the VCU Pauley Heart Center. For his leadership in philanthropy he was presented the first W. Robert Irby Philanthropic Leadership Award by the MCV Foundation. Dr. Vetrovec is a current member of the VCU Health System Board.

Dr. Vetrovec's scholarly interests involve improving the management of coronary artery disease, particularly related to catheterization and interventional techniques. He has had ongoing funding for clinical trials for over 20 years. He has authored or co-authored over 150 papers, eight book chapters and has edited two texts on interventional cardiology and serves on multiple cardiovascular journal editorial boards. Other major educational achievements include Co-Chairing the ACC/SCA&I Interventional Board Review Program for 5 years as well as the ACC Interventional Program at the American College of Cardiology Annual Scientific Meeting for 2 years. Dr. Vetrovec currently serves as a Consultant to the FDA New Cardiovascular Devices Panel and is a member of the Subspecialty Board on Cardiovascular

Disease of the American Board of Internal Medicine, the national qualifying board for cardiovascular specialists.

Dr. Vetrovec is a Fellow in the American College of Cardiology, and has served as Chairman of the Physician Workforce Advisory Committee, Governor for the State of Virginia and on the Board of Trustees, all in this organization. He is a Fellow and a past President of the Society for the Cardiac Angiography and Interventions. Dr. Vetrovec is a Past-President of the Association of Professors of Cardiology, an organization of his Cardiology Chair peers in academic cardiology. He is also a member and Past President of the Association of University Cardiologists, a select, 125 member group of leadership in Academic Cardiology. Dr. Vetrovec's International recognition includes membership in the Irish Cardiac Society, Royal College of Physicians of Thailand (Fellow) and the European Society of Cardiology (Fellow)

In addition to administrative, research and teaching activities, Dr. Vetrovec is an active clinical cardiologist, including performing catheterization and interventional procedures. In 1997, he was awarded "Clinician of the Year" by his physician colleagues in the University practice. He has also been recognized as one of the Best Doctors in the United States by Woodward/White, Inc. for over 12 years. Other clinical recognitions include the U.S. Registry of Who's Who of Outstanding Americans and One of the Country's Outstanding Cardiologists by Women's Day publication.

Dr. Vetrovec has served extensively within the Volunteer structure of the American Heart Association including President of the Richmond Council and the Virginia Affiliate as well as Chairman of the Mid Atlantic Region. He served on the National Board of the AHA in 1989-1990. In addition to his volunteer participation, he has also served as Chairman of the Catheterization Committee of the council on Clinical Cardiology. He co-chaired a State of the Art Program on Interventional Cardiology sponsored by the Clinical Council of the American Heart Association in 1993. In recognition of Dr. Vetrovec AHA contributions, he was awarded the National Award of Merit in 1991 and was the first recipient of the Richmond Golden Heart Award in 1997.
